Climate change is one of the biggest problems facing the world today. But, in order to solve climate change, we need to understand its cause.. we believe that the root cause of climate change is human greed.



In 2020, something strange happened, and it brought me hope. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the global economy took one of its biggest hits. Many factories and businesses shut down, and the world went into lockdown.

This happened while a huge global effort was being carried out to protect the lives of millions of vulnerable people from Covid-19. Countries, governments, and individuals chose to sacrifice the economy, temporarily, leaving millions of people without paying jobs.

WE WORK FOR FREE!



What we need is a world where society operates without money. If you look at nature, the trees, animals, and other forms of life, they are all able to live in harmony with one another without money. So why can't we do the same? We are the only species on the entire planet to be directly responsible for climate change. That alone should be enough evidence that we are the ones who need to change.

THE DARK TRUTH ABOUT THE GLOBAL ECONOMY

We need to start thinking outside of the realm of profits; if we continue with the way we are living we are, to use a technical term, totally screwed. It's time for a civilization-wide wake-up call! We need an entirely new economic model that runs off of volunteer work rather than money. The warnings are all around us and the time to act is now.

The problem with our current economy is that it says you can make "wealth" (earn profits) by destroying resources. For example, grocery stores around the world throw away billions of pounds of food every year rather than give it away for free because free food could hurt their profit margins. It is estimated that we produce 4 billion tons of food every year - more than enough to feed the 7.5 billion people who live on the planet - yet a large proportion of all food produced gets wasted. It is estimated that between 1.2 and 2 billion tons of food (i.e. between 30-50 percent of all food produced) is wasted every year.



Ask yourself this question: is it reasonable for the economy to destroy billions of tons of food while 800 million malnourished people exist in the world?

ABSOLUTELY NOT!

It's clear that our economic system is at war with the Earth. The problem we face is that our current economic model needs to continue to consume in order for it to work. But what our climate needs in order to avoid collapse is a complete disconnect from the economy so that it can recover. We need to change the current system so that it isn't at war with nature or we won't have a planet to live on.

We can either let the climate collapse destroy us, or we can do everything we can to change our current economic system to avoid that fate. The choice, as always, is up to us.

A RADICAL WAY OF LIVING TO SOLVE CLIMATE CHANGE



If we stopped working for money and worked voluntarily, using the technology and the resources that are now available to us, we could stop the climate crisis, end poverty, and
